

References In Print & Related Matters

George F. Bosworth - ESSEX Past & Present - Philip's County Readers 1904 (3rd) (cover title: ESSEX: its geography & history. Philip's County Manuals). The Preface to the 1st edition says, "The best thanks of the publishers & the author are given to the Rev. S. Baring-Gould, M.A., for allowing the insertion of part of chapter I from "Mehalah" ... This forms ch. III of the book, p.9,11. SBG also mentioned in the 'Glossary'.

Rev. Timothy Harley F.R.A.S. - MOON LORE - EP Publ. 1973 (originally published by Swan Sonnenschein 1895) contains excerpts from Curious Myths and Origins & Development I, and a reference to SBG's outline of a mythical hare story.

Myles Martin - WEST COUNTRY TALES - Breakaway Books 1981 - contains ch. 34 'Sabine' and ch.35 'The Lew Trenchard Ghost' (2pp.) The Devon County Council publication ARCHAEOLOGY OF THE DEVON LANDSCAPE refers to SBG on p.15f in connection with Grimspound and the hut circles.

J.H.B.Peel - ALONG THE GREEN ROADS OF BRITAIN - Cassell 1976/BCA 1977) - mentions SBG on p. 78 (on prehistoric tracks), p.87 (as a signatory and subscriber to the appeal for William Crossing in 1904) and p. 98 (a quotation on the state of the roads).

Bevis Hillier - YOUNG BETJEMAN - Murray 1988 - contains references to In The Roar Of The Sea on p.85, 321f.

D.St.Leger-Gordon - DEVONSHIRE - Hale 1950 - has 3 mentions: p.100, SBG outspoken against the vandalism of hut circles for use as granite gate-posts; p. 352, as President of the Devonshire Association 1896; and p. 354, in list of Devonshire literary men.

Worth's DARTMOOR - David & Charles 1988 (4th) - the author is generally in disagreement with SBG's findings, as the following references show:

p.2 with R. Burnard, hut survey at Broadun & Broadun Ring.

p.102 detailed refutation of SBG's accuracy on Erme Valley huts and prehistoric populations.

p.110 discussion of SBG's interpretation of Foales Arrishes hut circle p.131 denial of significance given by SBG to coloured pebbles & quartz Continued •

p.147 excavation of Yes Tor Bottom hut circle, & ref. T.D.A. report vo1.30 pp.99-104, the 5th report of the Dartmoor Exploration Committee

p.249f list of statistics on stone circles (1900); view that SBG copied previous reports

p.295f sceptical about SBG'S blowing-house at Deep Swincombe LA Book of Dartmoor p.114)

p.461 tabulation of barrows including Lew Trenchard (ref.T.D.A. vo1.30 p.78)

p.497 ref. A Book of Dartmoor 4th ed. 1923

Church Monthly for 1890 contains SBG's The Voice of the Lord, a 4 verse hymn (p.237); and for 1891 his St Mark's Day, a 5 verse hymn (p.91). (My copy has the 1890-92 numbers bound in with St. Laurence Thanet Parish Magazine - said on the spine to be 1889-91-92)

Angela Thirkell - THREE HOUSES - OUP 1931/Morley Baker 1970 mentions Lives of the Saints (p.122)

William Purcell - PILGRIM'S ENGLAND - Longman 1981. The author regards SBG's interpretation of Candida in Lives of the Saints as 'highly fanciful', and as his biographer reckoned SBG himself to be 'highly imaginative'.

Miles Jebb (ed.) - EAST ANGLIA; an anthology - National Trust/Barrie & Jenkins 1990 - contains extracts from Mehalah (p.64) & Cheap Jack Zita (p.90f)

Richard Cable was published in Chambers Journal throughout 1887. The 1886 volume of the same Journal contains an item entitled Mehalah over the initials J.P.F., with the explanation: "This poem is written on the chief character in the novel of the same name". One wonders if SBG had been consulted - and who was J.P.F.?
